

SMALL GROUP MINISTRY



PURPOSE STATEMENT

The purpose of a small group is to connect people to one another so that group members become more fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ by extending hope, transforming lives, and empowering people.

INVITATION

We invite you to become a member of Trinity's small group ministry. Some are under the impression that small groups are just another Bible study or a substitute for Sunday school. That is not true. We are: (1)not just a Bible study, (2) nor are we just a prayer group, (3) nor are we just a social group,(4) nor are we just a support group---small groups are all four and more. A small group is a gathering of 3 to 12 people meeting on a regular basis so that they may grow in the abundant life in Christ. The meetings are typically in a home setting with leadership provided by a facilitator. Small groups Biblically based (Acts 2:42-47; Romans 16:3-5). Non-believers are always welcome. About 75% of people come to faith through significant relationships with another person.

Janet Rodekohr: Lutherans can often be reluctant to speak about their faith, but small group gatherings help us put our faith into words among people we can trust.


